Are You In or Out?

In July we will begin a series "In or Out". We learn in scripture that we are either for or against Christ, there is no middle ground or Switzerland. I wonder if we take time to think about what that means to be all in for Jesus? Instead, are we satisfied to straddle the fence and conveniently compartmentalize our lives?

What would have happened if Noah had completed 90 percent of the ark? Imagine if he'd left a small hole in the hull or left off the roof, choosing instead to take a weekend off. Noah could not afford partial commitment. His salvation and his family's chance of surviving catastrophe were dependent upon his complete and total willingness to completely trust God. The same is true for us.

Real commitment is incredibly difficult, yet we are asked to do it every day. We're asked to commit to spouses, children, jobs, exercise programs, diets, and countless others. Many of these commitments require balance. We have to take time and effort from one to give to another. While this works with certain aspects of life, it does not work with our commitment to follow Jesus.

God does not expect us to be perfect. Much of the Christian life is a process of letting go of old habits and embracing our new life as a Christian. We won't always get it right, but we will keep moving forward if we remain steadfast in our commitment to God.

In Mark 3:34-35, Jesus says our commitment to Him should supersede every other relationship in our lives: "Then he looked at those seated in a circle around him and said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does God's will is my brother and sister and mother.'"

We are not capable of living perfect lives. Jesus doesn't ask for our perfection; He asks for our commitment. As Christians, we are called to press on the best we can after realizing and acknowledging our complete dependence on the sacrifice Jesus made. There can be no partial commitment when it comes to this one decision. We are either in or out.

Something to think about:

- On a scale of 1 to 10, where is your commitment to Jesus? Why did you pick the number you did?
- Who or what has the most influence on your day-to-day decisions? Where does Jesus fall in the order of influential voices in your life?
- What step do you need to take this week to make your relationship with Jesus your No. 1 priority?


Women Offering Worship

THINK ABOUT THIS

Many of us can relate to the reality of temptation—whether that's giving into it, facing the consequences of giving in, or feeling shame for our decisions. Temptation is both uniquely personal and universal. Which is why we want to spend time talking about it with students. We hope to help them do three things: navigate temptation when it comes up, recover when they give in, and remind them that no matter what they do or don't do, God is for them.



Daily Cues



Morning Time

Brainstorm a few positive words that describe your teenager. As they head out for the day, say something like, "When it comes to messing up or doing things we aren't proud of, sometimes we're hardest on ourselves. Know that when I look at you, I see someone who is (include the words you brainstormed.) Today, no matter what decisions you make, I want those to be the words you hear, telling you who you are."



Meal Time

During dinner, start a conversation about decision-making. Ease into sharing an age-appropriate example of a time you made a regrettable decision and gave into temptation as a teenager. Share about what you learned, the consequences, and what you wish you would have done differently. Use this time to let your teenager know you have been in their shoes and they aren't alone in battling temptation.



Their Time

Ask your teen who thier top three favorite influencers, Youtubers, or celebrities are right now. Take some time to learn about these people and what makes them someone your teenager wants to follow. Maybe even watch a video or two together.



Bed Time

Before your teenager goes to bed ask them, "If you had the chance to go back and do today again, is there anything you would change? How did decisions you made today line up with person you want to be? How can you make it so the things you know are true about you are reflected in the decisions you make?" Make sure the conversation ends with them seeing you as a safe place to talk about their mistakes.
