DON'T MAKE THANKSGIVING A DAY *Make It A Lifestyle*

Ephesians 5: 18-20 15 So be careful how you live. Don't live like fools, but like those who are wise. 16 Make the most of every opportunity in these evil days. 17 Don't act thoughtlessly, but understand what the Lord wants you to do. 18 Don't be drunk with wine, because that will ruin your life. Instead, be filled with the Holy Spirit, 19 singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, and making music to the Lord in your hearts. 20 And give thanks for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Learning to be thankful every day is not a new concept. It's an idea Jesus taught and a principle that Paul, the writer of Ephesians, tried to pass on to Christians in Ephesus almost 2,000 years ago.

Paul was a Christian missionary who was imprisoned for his faith. Yet in Ephesians 5:20, Paul encouraged the church to give thanks to God for all things. How could Paul, of all people, be thankful in every circumstance?



The answer is the Holy Spirit. When we ask Jesus into our lives, we receive the Holy Spirit to be our helper and our guide. And in the same breath that Paul encourages us to be thankful in all things, he says to fill up on the Holy Spirit instead of turning to wine, or whatever else used to bring us joy, because the Holy Spirit is far more valuable (Ephesians 5:18).

The Holy Spirit in us is what allows us to be thankful even when things aren't going right, to have peace when life feels chaotic, and to have hope when all seems hopeless. When we can't think of anything to be thankful for, the Holy Spirit reminds us that we can be thankful for Jesus, for the forgiveness of sins, for a relationship with God, and for the promise of eternal life.

Many days, thankfulness does not come easily. Right now, most of us could rattle off a list of the things wrong with ourselves and our lives. No matter how bad life seems, we have the ability to be thankful. We don't have to thank God for our problems, but we can thank Him for the strength He's building in us through them.

Something to think about:

- Think about all the conversations you had yesterday. Were your conversations marked by complaints or by gratitude?
- Do you believe it's really possible to be thankful in all circumstances? Why or why not?
- What's one thing you can thank Jesus for today?

The elders and deacons met in late October to nominate individuals for our committees and chairpersons for those committees. The immense amount of giftedness in our church is remarkable. God is so good. In the coming weeks, the elders will be spending some intentional time together at our retreat. Our goal is to plan for the future of Mt Pleasant Church. We intend to discuss and evaluate ministries, set expectations for how God can use our church to further His Kingdom, and consider ways to increase Biblical knowledge within our congregation.

In preparing for our retreat, a lesson from Mark 8:22-26 recently came into focus. This is the impactful story of Jesus healing the blind man at Bethsaida. As Jesus and his disciples came into the village, a blind man reached out to touch Jesus seeking his healing touch. Jesus then took the man outside of the village to talk and begin the process of healing him of his blindness; a retreat of some sort, if you will. Why didn't Jesus just heal the man where he was rather than taking him off by himself? It seems that Jesus wanted the man's full attention as he opened his eyes to his new life.

We also see this "retreating" when Jesus would go off by himself at times. In Luke 22:41, Jesus went off by himself to pray prior to being arrested. This happens throughout all four gospel accounts. Jesus' solidarity gave him the "retreat" he needed to lift up his disciples, his followers and all believers to God; just as he did in John 17. That is the goal of our retreat, seeking God in solidarity. Please pray for us as we do so, and know that you are in our thoughts and prayers as we meet.

As you may know, this is also a very important time for our church in regard to preparing for 2023 and beyond. We ask that you please be in prayer for the candidates that have been nominated for at-large members of the admin council, elders, committee members, and committee chairpersons. Voting for admin council and elder takes place on November 20th, along with the vote to approve the budget for next year.

In Deuteronomy 32 We are called to witness Moses last day on the earth. Moses decides to bid farewell with a song. Some people call it a song of ascent that will take us on a whirlwind journey through human history all the way to the End times. It is an epic Kingdom anthem, describing the patience, discipline and confidence of our King; the distractibility of his chosen; and over-enthusiastic judgmentalism of the Nations.

Moses sings a prophetic song to those who will listen. I wonder if our assignment will be to learn it, live it, teach to our children and sing it in the courts of worship. Moses knows this is no ordinary song. He is not just crooning.

What is the essence of Moses song? It is a summation, sung from Heaven's perspective of humanities entire season of influence on this planet. It is the chronicles of the past, the placing of context to the present, and the revelation of the future for two distinct groups of human beings. In one corner are the widely dispersed sons of Noah and in the other corner are the people called out by God.

The past, present, and future of these two groups will be narrated from heaven and will therefore help us see what this little adventure has really been all about from the beginning, and how it therefore must inevitably end.

We discover in the song, as go the covenant people of God, so goes all of humanity. There are, it turns out, two crucibles that determine how well, or how badly things go for God's people and creation.

The first crucible is how the Covenant people choose to relate to the Lord and respond to His calling upon their lives. If, the people of God listen to the voice of the King, love Him with all their heart, with all their soul, and with all their strength, obey/act on His covenant promises, and fulfill their assigned purpose as a kingdom of priest, they will thrive and the earth will flourish and yield a bounty, and every family on earth who wishes is offered the opportunity to share in the abundance.

BUT, on the other hand, if the People of God tune out and ignore the Kings voice and reject His directions and invest their time, assets, energy, creativity and passions in forsaking God's ways for the perversions of the nations around them – the earth travails. Paranoia and greed, fear and hate, cruelty and despair, start to control the narrative of all people and color their interactions. Nations, cultures, and ethnicities turn on one another and start to implode with self-hatred. And ultimately, all the families of the earth suffer or perceive themselves as victims looking around for someone to blame.

The first crucible always activates the second crucible. The second crucible is how the peoples of the world choose to respond to God's people. If the people of the earth respond favorable to Gods People whether they are obedient to God or not, they will be blessed, their land is fruitful, they prosper they maintain their sovereignty and borders, even if they maintain their pagan practices.

But, on the other hand, if they devalue, persecute, oppress or slander the people of God (whether they are walking in Covenant as they should or not), those individuals, ethnicities, cultures and nations begin to deteriorate. Their marriages and families disintegrate. Their economies struggle. Their education and information systems turn into paranoid propaganda machines, turning their populations into crazed mobs – easily manipulated by hatemongers, fearmongers, scandalmongers, gossipers, offense-peddlers, race and class envy inciters, pseudo-science and conspiracy theorists, perversion spreaders, and substance abusers.

The rest, as they say, is history. And it is all described in the song. Moses' song is a song describing the human condition on the one hand, and the Lord's redemptive plan on the other. So it is with good reason at the end of times we are told in Revelation 15 'from all the nations, tribes and tongues who overcome will sing the song of Moses, the servant of God' (15:3). Let all with ears to hear the prophetic voice of God give ear to this song. The heavens and the earth hear and understand Moses' message very well. Do you?

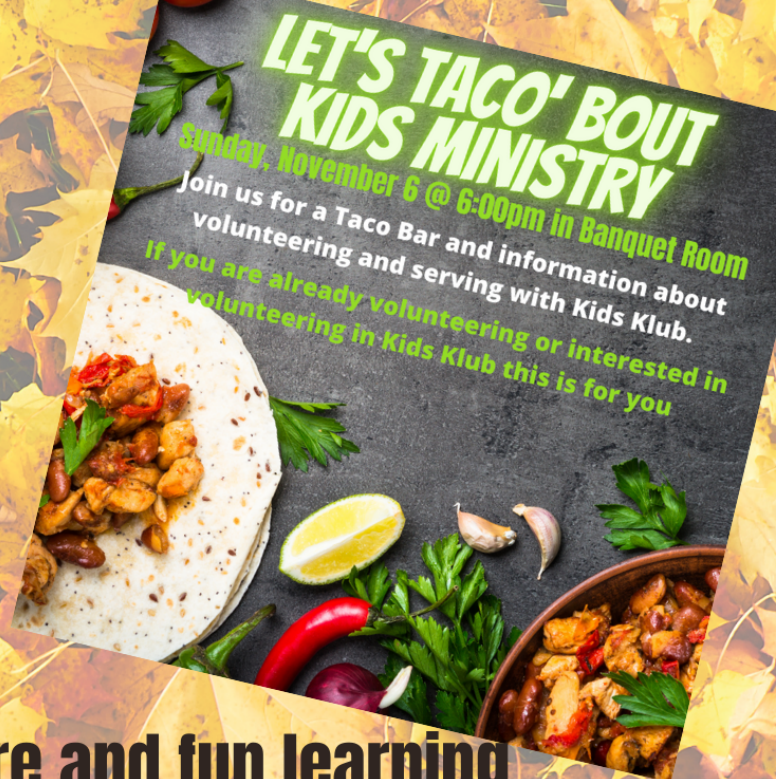

Ways to teach your child to be grateful

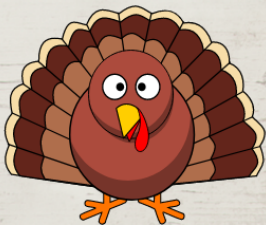
Model the same behavior you are teaching. Show kindness and always be grateful in all that you do. I promise the kids are watching.

MTP Connect

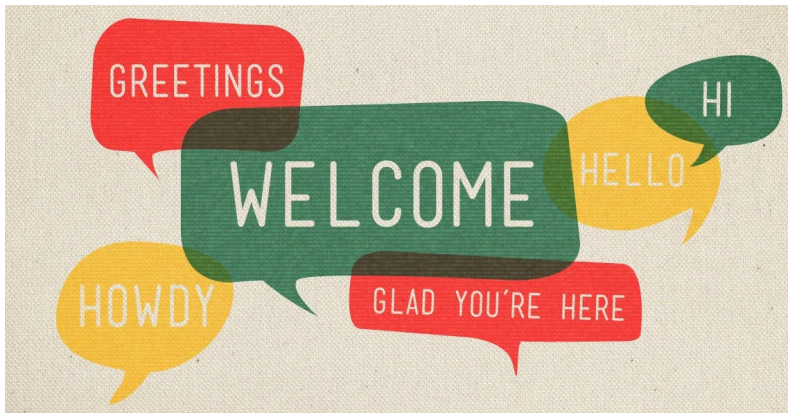

FOOD to families

"Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." Matthew 25:35-40

Jesus was telling them that when they provided food for the hungry, they were doing it for him.

We have an opportunity in December to provide food for 50 families in the Ledford and Oak Grove school district. If you are able to assist with this ministry, you can donate by cash or check (note FOOD TO FAMILIES) or you can donate online at MtPleasant.Church/Events

For over 20 years, Mt. Pleasant, Shady Grove and some others have provided a box of food to 50 families in our community. The families are chosen by the school social workers who are aware of families who are in need of help. The families receive the food a few days before the students get out for Christmas. During break, the children do not receive free lunch like they do while school is in session.

This year, we aren't sure of the funding to provide the food and with the increased cost we will either not be able to help as many families, or the families will get less food. Several years ago, a little boy walked out of the fellowship hall with his mother after receiving their box and said, "mommy, we get to eat tonight". I went into another room and cried, I haven't ever been hungry and unable to get something to eat. If you have any questions, I would love to be able to tell you more about this ministry.
