

ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL UPDATE

Here is an update from the Administrative Council regarding our church vote in February 2023, which was unanimously approved, to amend the by-laws to the following listed below:

Bylaw addition:

Article XII General Church Leadership

Section 12.01 Qualifications.

- a) Qualifications to serve as a leader in our church are articulated in 1 Timothy 3. Both men and women can serve in leadership positions based on the Biblical use of the term in reference to women in the New Testament.
- b) Leadership shall be members of the Church in good standing and be a member of the church before being elected or appointed to a leadership position. Leaders must be a member of the church in good standing for 3 years prior to being elected. A "member of the church in good standing" is defined as a person who commits their time, gifts, presence, service, and witness to the church on a regular basis.

Section 12.02 Term of Office, Removal and Vacancies.

- a) The term of office of chair or vice-chair leadership positions shall be no more than three (3) years. After a three-year term, the leader shall be replaced through a nominations process by elders and deacons.
- b) A leader may be removed from his/her position at any time for good cause. Good cause for removal includes, but is not limited to, the unexcused failure to attend three (3) consecutive council meetings (if specific role has a non-voting seat on the Administrative Council), or a lifestyle that is contrary to God's Word, or is not a church member in good standing. This action has oversight by the elders, deacons and/or administrative council chairpersons. Prior to removing a church leader, the process of mediation and reconciliation provided in Matthew 18:15-20 must be followed. A meeting of the Administrative Council to consider removing the leader would be the culmination of the process if reconciliation is not possible. The meeting shall be called and notice of the meeting must be given stating the removal of the leader. This would be the sole item on the agenda for such a meeting.
- c) Leadership vacancies should be elected by the prospective group, unless the vacancy is caused by the sudden removal by church leadership. If the group is not able to appoint a replacement, the administrative council will assist in appointing a new leader until another nominee can be appointed by the particular group.

Be available and accessible for when they want to talk.




MEAL TIME



Then Jesus said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore, pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." (Matthew 9:37-38)

Through their Anhelo Missions Michael and Mallorie Ramos labor for a harvest that feeds souls and bodies in the Carazo area of Nicaragua. The ministry combines sharing the Gospel message with teaching agriculture to Nicaraguans.

"We are passionate about using farming to bring the lost and hopeless to the feet of Jesus," Mallorie said in an email to Tina Grubbs, chairwoman of Mt. Pleasant's Mission Committee.

The Ramoses do that by helping people learn how to provide for themselves and their families, while also sharing the gospel through discipleship and biblical training.

The missionaries rely on support from Mt. Pleasant, other churches and individuals to fund several programs, which include:

- Huevos de Amor (Eggs of Love). Eggs are the cheapest protein source in Central America, according to Mallorie, and this project provides families with the means to produce their own eggs. For \$40, Anhelo gives one family a rooster, three hens and chicken wire.
- "The goal for this project is for families to have food for their little ones every day before they go to school," Mallorie said. "One egg a day, per child, provides them with enough protein to help them physically, mentally and spiritually."
- Gallinero de Amor (Community Chicken House). More than 100 chickens at the community chicken house provide eggs to distribute to local agencies. Those eggs are used to supplement the breakfast of fried rice and beans students eat at the region's Christian preschools, elementary schools and nonprofit organizations.
- Biblical Trainings. Each month the Anhelo Missions' pastor leads biblical training in the church and community. Bible study is taught, as well as classes on caring for chickens and the importance of one egg a day per child.
- Cultivating. The Ramos family hopes to counter the fluctuating economy and food needs in Nicaragua by encouraging people to cultivate their own foods. They teach good gardening practices and say tomatoes, cucumbers, cabbage, green peppers, squash, onions and potatoes are relatively easy to grow.

Anhelo means desire in English and the name of their ministry through their Anhelo Missions reflects the Ramoses' desire to plant Gospel seeds.

"We believe God wants to use every resource available, whether it is through health, education, or agriculture," Mallorie said. "We also believe God wants to be present in every area of our lives."

Mallorie and Michael are very much present in the lives of those they serve, and not just in gardens.

"The reality is that we serve where we are needed," Mallorie said. "This often includes transporting the sick, delivering food, helping kids with school expenses, and supporting our local schools. We are currently serving and leading our church band in worship, as well as teaching instruments –drums, acoustic guitar and bass guitar – throughout the week."

Mallorie and Michael have one daughter, Audrey.


