## **Parental Expectations**

As we get started with The Point, we ask that you familiarize yourself and your child(ren) with the Code of Conduct, Social Media/Photography policy, volunteer expectations, and the course information.

The Point is hoping to extend opportunities for growth in your family's relationship with Jesus Christ as well as in academics and experiences. It is the expectation you will fulfill items such as transcript preparation and college/trade readiness within your personal homeschool journey. In addition, we are unable to offer tutoring, IEP assistance, after-school care, or similar items.

Using an acronym helps parents and students remember our basic rules, and apply them more easily.

WORKS is derived from James 2:26, "For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also." (KJV) Each portion of the acronym is also a Biblically-based character trait.

<u>**Wisdom**</u> is God's truth guiding your thoughts and actions, and has Psalm 111:15 as the reference verse.

From John 14:21 comes **Obedience**, where we obey the first time, every time [with a happy heart!].

Be someone God and others can count on -**<u>Responsibility</u>** is part of Galatians 6:4-5.

# Code of Conduct (con't)

To have a friend, you have to be a friend. <u>**Kindness**</u> is an integral part of this - guidance is found in Ephesians 4:32

Finally, <u>Self-Control</u> covers many aspects such as action, health, wellness, and thought, amongst others. Don't be "...like a city that is broken-down, and without walls" as Proverbs 25:28 cites.

## **Code of Conduct Violations**

Although it is expected students will work to keep our Code of Conduct, there may be students not willing to follow our path. For these situations, the following guidelines are set forth for disciplinary action:

- 1. Student will be set apart from the classroom, and parents will be notified of misconduct.
- 2. Meeting with parents, student, teacher, and Director will occur to discuss continued misconduct.
- 3. If student decides further steps are necessary, student will be dismissed from The Point.

## **Additional Guidelines**

#### Social Media and Photography Policy

From time to time, we will take photos or videos to share or use on our website and social media.

It is understood that the parent(s)/guardian(s) gives Mt. Pleasant Church permission to use my child(ren)'s image. The parent(s)/guardian(s) understand(s) the images may be used in print publications, online publications, presentations, websites, and social media. The parent(s)/guardian(s) also understand(s) that no royalty, fee, or other compensation shall become payable by reason of such use. The parent(s)/guardian(s) understand(s) that this permission does not expire.

If the parent(s)/guardian(s) wish to revoke this permission, he/she/they must notify the church via email to <u>office@mtpleasant.church.</u>

This policy will also be part of the registration form.

## Additional Guidelines Volunteer Expectations

It is expected all parents will volunteer at times throughout the semester. Opportunities to help include, but are not limited to:

- Check-in
- Pick up
- Hall Assistants/Monitors
- Security
- Teacher's Assistants
- Nursery(for teachers/ volunteers needing this)

Clear and current background checks will be required, and will be completed through Active Screening Faith. If you have not completed a background check for a Mt. Pleasant Church event or ministry, you will receive an email from this organization to complete the background check.

If you are unable to volunteer due to extenuating circumstances, a volunteer opt-out fee of \$125 per semester will be due.

In addition, in our goal to have at least two adults in the classrooms at all times, we ask that a minimum of 20 spots be filled by each registering family.
