Easter Was the Greatest Miracle Of All

Without Easter the apostle Paul says our faith is useless.

For if there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised either. And if Christ has not been raised, then all our preaching is useless, and your faith is useless. And we apostles would all be lying about God—for we have said that God raised Christ from the grave. But that can't be true if there is no resurrection of the dead.

1 Corinthians 15:13-15.

Our whole faith and the power behind everything we believe and teach are wrapped up in the fact that Jesus died, then rose from the grave. If there is no Easter, no resurrection, we are hopeless.

But Easter did happen, and because of that, we can place our trust in God's promises. Jesus overcame death and established Himself as having authority over all things. That means, when Jesus makes a promise, we can believe Him.

There are 10 Promises we have because of Easter

1. We who are believers will have immortality.

"Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life, but whoever rejects the Son will not see life, for God's wrath remains on them" (John 3:36).

2. I don't have to be a slave to sin.

"It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery" (Galatians 5:1).

3. I am a new creation.

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!" (2 Corinthians 5:17).

4. I don't have to fear.

"There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love" (1 John 4:18).

5. I don't have to worry.

"Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you" (1 Peter 5:7).

6. God wants good things for me.

"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28)

7. I am not alone.

"Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." Hebrews 13:5

8. God wants to hear my requests.

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened" (Matthew 7:7-8).

9. One day all things will be made right

"And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me so that you also may be where I am" (John 14:3).

10. God loves me.

"For God so loved the world that He gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16).

All of these promises may seem hard to believe. The good news is the one who promised has proven Himself trustworthy. Every Easter, we are reminded that nothing is too big for God to handle.

The greatest promise of all: Even though we deserved death and should be eternally separated from God, Jesus came to Earth and gave His life up so we could live with Him forever. Jesus chose to reconcile all of us who believe and He was willing to face death and suffering to do so. This Easter, let's celebrate like we have a God that refused to leave us on our own. He is a God of great promises, a God who is faithful. Let's celebrate this miracle and invite everyone we know to experience it with us.


